#### Shandaken Tunnel Outlet SPDES Permit General Meeting - February 24, 2009

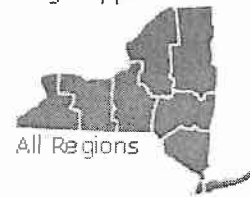

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### Negative Declaration

**Montgomery County** - The City of Amsterdam City Council, as lead agency, has determined that the proposed Water Filtration Plant Improvements will not have a significant adverse environmental

impact. The action involves new treatment plant equipment to be located in an existing building at the raw water source in Glen Wild, new filtration and water treatment equipment to be housed in a proposed addition attached to the existing filter plant, and replace the existing backwash tank with a new tank located on the filter plant site.
